Attendance/Leave of absence requests


We have seen an increasing number of children absent from school, for holidays/birthdays/special days and to have received a number of requests for exceptional leave, over the past few weeks. As you will be aware, I am unable to authorise such requests, other than in truly exceptional circumstances. For your information, family holidays are not considered exceptional. The impact on the children, of missing time in school, should not be underestimated, both academically and especially at this age, socially. It is worth noting, a child with an attendance rate of 90% (20 days of absence), over the course of a year, is classed as persistently absent by the Department for Education. Please take note of term dates, available on our website, and organise holidays and days out, during school closure periods.





Guildford..Christmas

Guildford has two main Christmas trails for 2025: the outdoor, ticketed **Illuminate Guildford Light Trail** at the Castle (Nov 15 - Jan 4) with lights and food, and the free **12 Days of Christmas Window Trail** in the town centre (Dec 5 - Jan 11) for families to find letters in shop windows for a prize draw, plus the **Guildford Museum's own free, drop-in Christmas trail** inside (Nov 29 - Jan 3), perfect for ages 5+, helping Father Christmas find presents.

The Godalming area offers child-friendly Christmas fun with National Trust trails at <u>Winkworth Arboretum</u> (Nutcracker themed) & <u>Claremont Landscape Garden</u> (Penguin trail), farm experiences at <u>Godstone Farm</u> & <u>Bocketts Farm</u>, plus local markets like <u>Godalming Christmas Market</u> with Santa, workshops at <u>Farnham Maltings</u> (cupcake decorating) & <u>The Little Gym Godalming</u> (Santa's Grotto), and even pantos in nearby Guildford & Camberley. Look for festive trails, Santa visits, workshops, and markets for a magical time.







Young Carers

Did you know there are an estimated 15,000 young carers in Surrey? According to Action for Young Carers Surrey, this number may actually be much higher. Organisations such as Carers Trust suggest that as many as 1 in 5 children could be taking on caring responsibilities at home without being identified.

That means there could be at least two young carers in every classroom.

A young carer is a child or young person who helps to look after a family member who may have a mental health condition, a disability, a neurological diagnosis, or another long-term health need. Their responsibilities can vary and may include:

- Helping to prepare meals
- · Assisting someone with dressing or daily tasks
- Supporting a sibling who needs extra care



While many young carers take pride in helping their families, these additional responsibilities can sometimes affect their schoolwork, friendships, and daily life.
