Throughout the year, we proactively teach the children how to keep themselves safe. This is part of our Personal Social and Health Education but it is also, a large part of our school ethos. One aspect of keeping safe is road safety. This area is taught regularly as using roads and pavements are a key aspect of our curriculum. Teaching the children to follow road safety is mostly taught in context, such as walking to School. This is very powerful and helps the children to put into practice these safety skills. The children are keen to ensure that everybody in our community are keeping themselves safe and readily comment if cars are not parking safely or blocking pavement access. You can help your child by being a good role model when selecting where to park and how you use the area around the school entrance at busy periods of the day. Remember to keep safe!

As we come into the summer months, children may be playing outside more. Please remember the importance of ensuring your children are safe i.e., Whilst in the park keeping an eye on who they are playing with and their interactions with others and whilst playing in the road outside or around houses.

Conversations round everyday life play a big part in communications between staff and children at Moss Lane. As a school we work hard to ensure that children feel safe and are able to communicate anything and that telling the truth is always the best option with this in mind we encourage families to be honest about reasons for absences as we need to record these on our attendance systems correctly.

# Surrey CC Update: Shaping Surrey's future

Surrey County Council have asked us to share the following information with families:

Surrey County Council's full devolution and Local Government Reorganisation (LGR) plan has now been published. It is subject to Cabinet approval on 7 May. Once approved, it will be submitted to government by 9 May.

The proposal shows two unitary councils, with an East and West geography as

shown in the map image below. These two councils would replace the existing 12 councils and unlock further devolution in Surrey (see below).

Detailed analysis within the plan shows that two councils would be the most beneficial model for Surrey's future, with similar land area, population, house building targets, business activity, homelessness and total miles of public highways. It also considers the differing levels of debt that the two authorities would potentially inherit.

The plan also strengthens local community engagement with community level boards proposed across Surrey, enabling residents to have a say in services and decisions that affect them.

Once submitted to government, printed copies of the proposal will be made available at all Surrey libraries.
